2. Burden

3. Principles of Formation

The same principles for the formation of the vital groups

- Much prayer
- Thorough fellowship





4. Service

- Meeting together weekly to:
 - Pray and fellowship
 - Enjoy the ministry books
 - Find ways to promote reading
 - Provide "direction, encouragement, and incentive"

Setting up a Book Display

1. Display Functions

- A display to showcase the "riches"
- A library for lending books
- A sales counter for ordering or buying books

2. LSM Display/Library Packages

- The previous book packages are not available, but are still displayed at the Ministry Conference Center (MCC)
- Churches should create a church-tailored package with LSM assistance
- The packages shown herein are only examples for churches to consider

3. Locations for the Display

- Meeting Halls
- Homes of the Saints
- Rented Meeting Rooms
- Public Places
- Retail Shops

4. Finding suitable furniture

- Portable racks, stands, etc.
- Fixed shelves, racks, stands, etc.
- Purchase online or at local retail stores

Operating a Display/Library

1. Lending Books

- Some books will be missing from the display some of the time
- Two set option: one for displaying and another for lending books



Operating a Display/Library

2. Selling Books

- Helping saints to order from the Living Stream Ministry
- Selling books directly from the display and replenishing the books from Living Stream Ministry
- Option for selling from display: stock multiple copies of a book

1. Initiating reading schedules

- Whole-church reading schedules for daily, weekly, and yearly readings
- Lists for college, YP, and new ones
- Special, one-time reading gatherings
- Weekend reading camps/conferences
- Online reading groups

2. Promote Lending (1)

- The "librarians" must have an inward burden for their readers (saints) knowing the:
 - Spiritual health of the saints
 - Impact and effect of the ministry publications on the saints

2. Promote Lending (2)

- Not mechanical book check out
- But seeking out the saints and recommending books that will benefit them
- It's a way to motivate, monitor,
 and train the saints to read

2. Promote Lending (3)

- You cannot be a typical librarian
- You must be familiar with the book content of the books you plan to loan to others by reading them, even if only casually

2. Promote Lending (4)

- Pray to get a burden for some saints, especially the new ones, young people, or newer believers
- Not merely making announcements, but you must GO to the saints one by one to lend them a book

2. Promote Lending (5)

The saints need lending because they are not motivated to read books

You are there not only to lend, but also to motivate, to monitor, and train them to read

2. Promote Lending (6)

Lend an appropriate book based on your reading and the prayer for the reader

Use a sticker to add your name and contact information to the books you lend for follow up

2. Promote Lending (7)

- Get the book borrower's contact information
- Follow up your lending by checking on them regularly according to a schedule

2. Promote Lending (8)

Have the reader share their enjoyment by speaking, texting, posting on the internet, or writing in a journal or writing a report

2. Promote Lending (9)

- 1953-Br. Lee asked trainees to write book reports on the Spirit of Christ
- ► 1990s-Howard Higashi had leading brothers write outlines of their life-study reading

2. Promote Lending (10)

- By providing incentives for reading such as some kind of reward (books, trips, gift cards)
- Based on Br Lee's word to give "direction, encouragement, and incentive" to promote reading

2. Promote Lending (11)

Finally, pray much about your readers and ask the Lord to bless them and enlighten them through their reading

3. Initiate mini-conferences or trainings

Heightening awareness of reading through outlines, videos, audios, or live guest speakers



4. Promote setting up a display or library

- Personal home libraries for display, personal use, giving away, or as a lending library
- Sponsoring display racks or bookstands in public places

- 5. Take the lead to practice other ways to promote reading, lending, or giving of the books:
 - Sharing the Nuggets and Gems eBooklets
 - Buying books for lending or giving them away, both paper version and eBooks

- 6. Coordinate with LSM to "trumpet" their products and programs
 - Know the current burden, new books, and promotions
 - Be familiar with the LSM website and their products

7. Being a good minister of Christ Jesus (1 Tim. 4:6)

I am deeply burdened by the fact that many who love the Lord Jesus and seek Him have been deceived and frustrated. We must find a way to share with them the spiritual riches the Lord has provided us. Many who truly love the Lord are starving. We must take up the burden to supply them with food. We all need to be good ministers of Christ, serving others with His riches. Let us first be nourished ourselves and then minister this nourishment to all the people of God. (Life-study of 1 Timothy, msg. 8, p. 72)
